Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Plays alongside others.
- Interested in others' play and starting to join in.
- Plays in a group extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Separates from main carer with encouragement.
- Becoming more confident in new social situations.
- Responds to a few appropriate boundaries with encouragement and support.
- Seeks comfort from familiar adults when needed.
- Can take turns and share resources.

Communication & Language

- Understands simple sentences.
- Uses simple sentences.
- Understands more complex sentences.
- Uses language to share feelings, experiences and thoughts.
- Beginning to use more complex sentences to link thoughts.
- Beginning to talk about things and people that are not present.
- Shows interest in play with songs, sounds and rhymes.

Physical Development

- Shows ontrol in holding and using mark making tools.
- Imitates drawing simple shapes, such as circles and lines.
- Runs safely on whole foot.
- Moves freely and with confidence.
- Mounts stairs, steps or climbing equipment using alternate feet.
- Beginning to recognise danger and seek support of an adult for help.
- Clearly communicates wet or soiled nappy or pants.
- Shows some awareness of bladder urges.
- Beginning to be independent in self-care.
- Drinks well without spilling.

Literacy

- Has some favourite stories.
- Repeats words and phrases from familiar stories.
- Enjoys rhyming and rhythmic activities.
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Looks at books independently.
- Handles books carefully and holds them the correct way up.
- Distinguishes between the different marks they make.

Mathematics

- Recite some number names in sequence.
- Select a small number of objects from a group when asked.
- Begin to make comparison between quantities.
- Use some number names accurately in play.
- Beginning to use the language of size.

Anticipates specific time based events such as meal time and home time.

Understands some talk about immediate, past or future.

Shows an interest in shape and space.

Understanding the World

- Has a sense of own immediate family and relations.
- Enjoys pictures and stories about themselves, their family and other people.
- Beginning to have their own friends.
- Remember where objects belong.
- Notices detailed features of their environment.
- Remember and talk significant events in their lives.
- Talk about why things happen and how things work
- Enjoy playing with small-world models e.g. Train track, Happy Street etc.
- Operates mechanical toys.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Taps out simple repeated rhythms.
- Joins in singing favourite songs.
- Enjoys joining in with dancing and ring games.
- Experiments with colours and marks.
- Beginning to use representation to communicate.
- Beginning to make-believe by pretending.
- Engages in imaginative role-play based on own first hand experiences.
